# DELF PRIM - PRIMARY SCHOOLS

#### **About DELF Prim**

The DELF Prim is an official certificate awarded by the Ministry of National Education in France to certify the proficiency in French as a Foreign Language of children aged 7 to 12.

Specially drafted for children, DELF Prim is composed of individual certificates and is divided into three levels: DELF Prim A1.1. DELF Prim A1 and DELF Prim A2.

## Why has your child taken the DELF Prim?

- To reward your child's work at school and treat him/her to his/her first certificate of French.
- To officially attest the level of French of your child to enter a bilingual or French School.
- To give your child the opportunity to be well prepared to pass the next levels of DELF through his/her progress at school.

## What does the DELF Prim consist of?

The exam topics are made to suit the age group's interest: immediate environment (family, personal details, interests, friends), everyday situations, etc.

# DELF JUNIOR -SECONDARY/HIGH SCHOOLS

#### **About DELF Junior**

DELF is an official qualification awarded by the Ministry of National Education in France to certify the competency of candidates from outside France in the French language. The junior version of DELF is perfectly fit for teenagers between 13 and 17 years old in middle and high-school.

DELF Junior is composed of four independent diplomas that correspond to 4 levels: DELF Junior A1, DELF Junior A2, DELF Junior B1, DELF Junior B2. These diplomas are valid for life.

## Why has your child taken the DELF Junior?

- ▶ DELF are internationally recognized diplomas that permit the certification of French language abilities.
- They allow to highlight skills in French for personal, scholars, or university purposes.
- → DELF Junior tests constitute a good stage to motivate teenagers in their French learning by recognizing the efforts they made to learn French.

### What does the DELF Junior consist of?

The materials take into account the interests of young people and allow to assess four skills:

#### **About DELF Tout Public**

DELF is a French language proficiency certificate awarded by the Ministry of National Education in France. This internationally recognized diploma evaluates your ability to communicate, both in speaking and writing with French speakers. It is useful to anyone wanting to pursue higher education studies in France or in French. It is also a requirement for employers who want new hires to have a certain level in French.

#### What does it cover?

The DELF covers 4 of the 6 language proficiency levels of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR).
