DELTA PRIM - PRIMARY SCHOOLS

About DELTA Prim

The DELTA Prim is an official certificate awarded by the Ministry of National Education in France to certify the proficiency in French as a Foreign Language of children aged 7 to 12.

Specially drafted for children, DELTA Prim is composed of individual certificates and is divided into three levels: DELTA Prim A1.1, DELTA Prim A1 and DELTA Prim A2.

Why has your child taken the DELTA Prim?

- To reward your child's work at school and treat him/her to his/her first certificate of French.
- To officially attest the level of French of your child to enter a bilingual or French School.
- To give your child the opportunity to be well prepared to pass the next levels of DELTA through his/her progress at school.

What does the DELTA Prim consist of?

The exam topics are made to suit the age group's interest: immediate environment (family, personal details, interests, friends), everyday situations, etc.

DELTA JUNIOR - SECONDARY/HIGH SCHOOLS

About DELTA Junior

DELTA is an official qualification awarded by the Ministry of National Education in France to certify the competency of candidates from outside France in the French language. The junior version of DELTA is perfectly fit for teenagers between 13 and 17 years old in middle and high-school.

DELTA Junior is composed of four independent diplomas that correspond to 4 levels: DELTA Junior A1, DELTA Junior A2, DELTA Junior B1, DELTA Junior B2. These diplomas are valid for life.

Why has your child taken the DELTA Junior?

- DELTA are internationally recognized diplomas that permit the certification of French language abilities.
- They allow to highlight skills in French for personal, scholars, or university purposes.
- DELTA Junior tests constitute a good stage to motivate teenagers in their French learning by recognizing the efforts they made to learn French.

What does the DELTA Junior consist of?

The materials take into account the interests of young people and allow to assess four skills:

DELTA TOUT PUBLIC - UNIVERSITIES

About DELTA Tout Public

DELTA is a French language proficiency certificate awarded by the Ministry of National Education in France. This internationally recognized diploma evaluates your ability to communicate, both in speaking and writing with French speakers. It is useful to anyone wanting to pursue higher education studies in France or in French. It is also a requirement for employers who want new hires to have a certain level in French.

What does it cover?

The DELTA covers 4 of the 6 language proficiency levels of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR).

CEFR LEVEL	DESCRIPTION
Basic Language User	
A1 Beginner	At this level, you have a basic ability to communicate and exchange information in a simple way. For example, you can identify colours, and say times
A2 Elementary	At this level, you have the capacity to handle simple, everyday information and can express feelings in common, uncomplicated circumstances
Independent Language User	
B1 Lower Intermediate	You are able to express yourself in familiar daily situations and to deal in a general way with non-routine information as long as it isn't too demanding
B2 Upper Intermediate	You have the ability to achieve most goals and discuss a wide range of topics. Academic materials, and specialized materials may be troublesome, but common situations are within this person's grasp.
